Quick Start Guide for Teaching Hospitals

What teaching hospitals should know.

Registration in the Open Payments system is voluntary but is strongly encouraged by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). Your participation in the Open Payments program helps to ensure the integrity and accuracy of any payment data attributed to specific teaching hospitals before it is published online by CMS.

Who should register.

Only organizations that appear on the CMS Open Payments teaching hospital list can register. You can view the list for each calendar year online at cms.gov/openpayments/resources/covered-recipients.

If your teaching hospital does not appear on the list, it is not reportable and does not need to be registered. Please note that not all teaching hospitals on the list are currently registered in the system.

If you are a physician or non-physician practitioner who works for a teaching hospital, you will need to register as an individual to check Open Payments data attributed to you.

A two-part process.

Registration requires a two-part personal and professional identity check and verification to ensure the security, privacy, and integrity of teaching hospital data.

- Create a user account in the CMS Identity
 Management System (IDM) at portal.cms.gov
- Create a profile and complete the registration process for reportable teaching hospitals

Registration Tip

Gather this information before you start:

- Basic personal information
- Job title
- Business contact information
- Primary business address
- Hospital business address
- Hospital "Doing Business As" entity name—must match CMS records exactly
- Hospital Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN)—must match CMS records exactly

Annual Cycle

Make the most of your access by becoming familiar with the annual Open Payments cycle:



All Year

Reporting entities collect payment data for current program year.



Feb 1 - March 31

Reporting entities submit payment data (collected the previous year) to CMS.



• April 1 – May 15

Teaching hospitals can review and dispute data prior to publication.



April 1 - May 30

Reporting entities can review and correct data.



June 30

CMS publishes Open Payments data.
