Activity Description:

The purpose of this activity is to improve the understanding of the basic concepts of quality measures and key elements needed to begin the measure development process. The presentation will review the types of data commonly used in quality measures, the types of quality measures, and the associated strengths and limitations of each. Other ways to classify measures will also be discussed including the National Quality Strategy aims and priorities, Institute of Medicine (IOM) domains of care, scoring methods, care settings and types of composite measures.

Learning Objectives: By the end of the presentation, you should be able to:

- A. Identify the four measure evaluation criteria
- B. Identify points during the measure development and maintenance cycles that measures will be formally evaluated
- C. Describe where NQF requires documentation of how a measure meets the Measure Evaluation Criteria
- D. Identify one similarity between measure evaluation and selection criteria

Activity Goal:

The overall goal of this activity is to inform CMS staff, contractors and others who are involved in quality measure development regarding the processes adopted by CMS for the development and maintenance of quality measures to be used in CMS programs. Quality measures that are used by CMS must be of high caliber and ideally should be able to receive endorsement by the National Quality Forum. This informational series will instruct the audience regarding the use of a set of standardized processes adopted by CMS and aligned with the criteria used by the National Quality Forum. The information described in this series will provide the foundation for the participant to develop quality measures meeting the needs of CMS.
