I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Background: The purpose of this change request is to notify all interested parties that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) needs to change the contractor workload numbers for the Part A and Part B workloads in the States of Kentucky and Ohio as well as the workload number of the Regional Home Health Intermediary workload for region "B" when those workloads are transitioned to the J15 A/B MAC. The effective date of all Part A transitions will fall on Monday, but the effective dates of the Part B transitions will fall on a Saturday. This is necessary to accommodate the software that will be used to create and populate the new Part B CICS production regions.
