<p>Mr. Fung, a 30-year career employee in the federal government, is the agency's first Chief Technology Officer as well as the Deputy Director of Office of Information Services.</p> <p>Mr. Fung, with considerable expertise in computer system modernization, security and operation, served 17 years at the Department of Defense as program manager for various technology initiatives, 3 years at the U.S. Information Agency and 10 years at the Department of Treasury. Prior to joining CMS, he was Deputy Chief Information Officer for Treasury's Financial Management Service (FMS), where he spent more than 7 years modernizing FMS' technology infrastructure, which provides government-wide payments and accounting operations.</p> <p>As Chief Technology Officer, Mr. Fung focuses on systems architecture, tools, system security and networks. His responsibilities include ensuring the optimization of CMS' investments in information technology and enhancing the cost-effective delivery of services to beneficiaries. Mr. Fung works in CMS' Office of Information Services, which maintains the CMS data infrastructure for the Medicare and Medicaid programs. The office provides connectivity, data maintenance and dissemination, and technical assistance to internal and external data users. For past 12 months, Mr. Fung has focused on the implementation and operational readiness of MMA Title I and II related systems and the Agency's IT modernization initiatives.</p> <p>A native of Shanghai, China, Mr. Fung grew up in the San Francisco Bay area and is currently a resident of Silver Spring, Md. He received a bachelor's degree in 1969 and a master's degree in 1970, both in engineering, and a master's degree in business administration in 1972, all from the University of California at Berkeley.</p>
