

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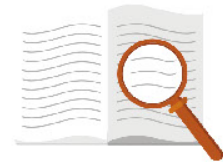

Welcome to the WCMSAP

This site provides an interface for entry of Workers' Compensation Medicare Set-Aside Arrangements (WCMSAs) proposals. Attorneys, Medicare beneficiaries, claimants, insurance carriers, and WCMSA vendors may use this site to enter the case information directly. The site also provides attorneys, Medicare beneficiaries, claimants, insurance carriers, and WCMSA vendors with the ability to track their submitted cases and the statuses will call inquiry to the Benefits Coordination & Recovery Center (BCRC) or the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

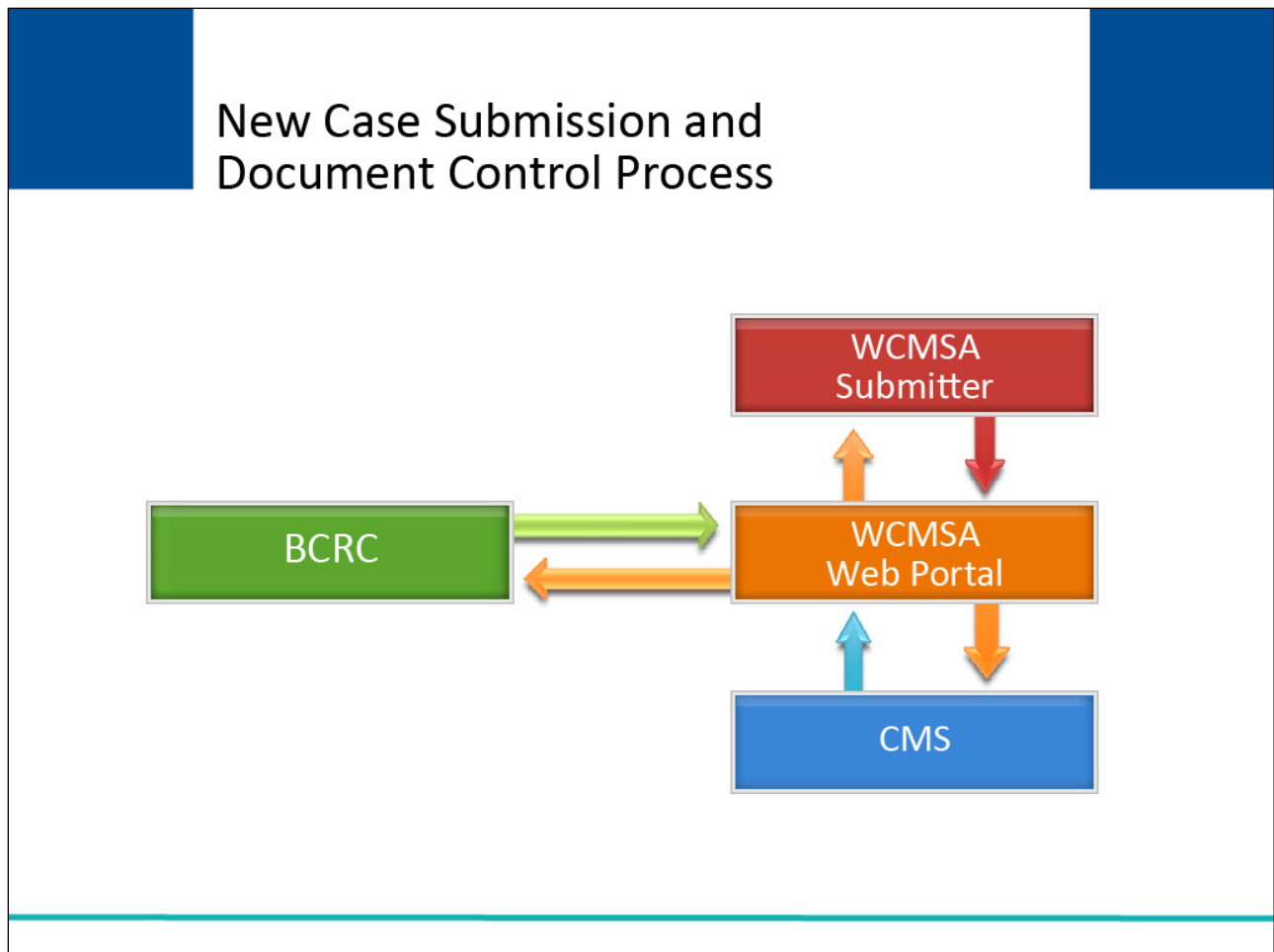

CMS requires a mechanism to receive and evaluate future medical and future prescription drug costs for inclusion in WCMSAs.

The WCMSAP is a web-based application that allows attorneys, beneficiaries, claimants, insurance carriers, representative payees,


and WCMSA vendors to create a work-in-progress case, submit WCMSA cases, perform case lookups, append documentation to a case, receive alerts relating to case activity, and submit a re-review request.

This diagram shows all entities that will have knowledge of the WCMSAP and that will interact with it: the WCMSA Submitter, the Benefits Coordination & Recovery Center (BCRC) and CMS.

Slide 6 of 17 - Case Submittal


Case Submittal



Prepare a work-in-progress case as information is gathered



Users **not** required to submit all of the mandatory data input fields and files until ready to submit case

WCMSAP users have the ability to create and store a work-in-progress case which gives the user the opportunity to gather necessary case information (prior to submitting a case to CMS for review).

Users will not be required to submit all of the mandatory data input fields and files until they are ready to submit the case.

Slide 7 of 17 - Real-Time Case Tracking

Real-Time Case Tracking

-  Track submitted cases without phone inquiry
-  Fast case feedback
-  Use Case Lookup and View Alert Functions

The WCMSAP provides the ability to track submitted cases without inquiry to the BCRC or CMS.


Phone calls to obtain case status information will no longer be necessary; status on a given case can be viewed on a real-time basis, via the Web Portal.

With the introduction of the WCMSAP, WCMSA submitters receive almost instantaneous feedback regarding a case.


If you are missing case documentation or have incorrect data input, you are notified (via email). Case Lookup and View Alert functions are also available.

Case Updates



Append new files to replace missing documentation



Replace incorrect documentation

If case documentation is missing or has incorrect data input, the submitter may append new files or replace case documentation.

Slide 9 of 17 - Expedited Case Receipt and Processing

Expedited Case Receipt and Processing



Receipt and review of proposals on a more expedited basis

The WCMSAP allows for the electronic receipt, review and/or processing of WCMSA proposals for future medical and prescription drug costs on a more expedited basis.

Slide 10 of 17 - Re-Review Requests

Re-Review Requests

 Request re-review of WCMSAP submitted cases in approved status

You can use the WCMSAP to submit a request to CMS to re-review a case if you disagree with the Regional Office's decision.

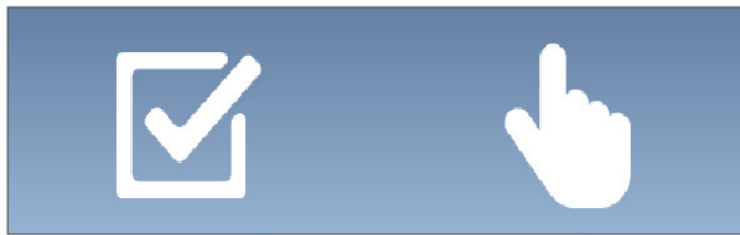
A WCMSAP case is eligible for re-review when it is in approved status and a re-review has not already been requested.

Since the WCMSA Web Portal is a Web-based application, you must have Internet access to log into the system.

Users with either Internet Explorer v7 or higher or Firefox v3.5 or higher, will be able to type the URL (<https://www.cob.cms.hhs.gov/WCMSA/>) directly into the Web address line to access the system login page.

To upload case documentation, users must have a document scanner.

Users must also have a Portable Document Format (PDF) software, such as Adobe Acrobat, but any PDF software will work.
