## Measure Testing

How do we know if a quality measure is technically suitable? How do we assess the strengths and weaknesses of a measure? Like any other product, we test it. Measure testing allows us to:

- Refine measure specifications before they are finalized.
- Rethink the measure’s importance, if necessary.
- Re-evaluate the feasibility, usability, and scientific acceptability of the measure.

Measures may be tested one at a time, or as part of a set. Information gathered through Measure Testing is a part of full measure development. Proper Measure Testing and analysis is critical to measure approval by CMS and endorsement by the National Quality Forum (NQF).

As a process, measure Testing requires going through several steps in multiple cycles, including:

- Developing and implementing a measure testing plan
- Analyzing the test results, and
- Repeatedly refining and retesting the measure until it meets testing criteria.

Stakeholder input is often used at several points during the testing process. This input can take many forms, including but not limited to, formal [technical expert panels](#) (TEPs), consultation with subject matter experts (SMEs), outreach to professional associations or patient advocacy groups,

and [public comments](#). It is very important to follow up on those communications by providing additional opportunities for stakeholders to comment on the results of their inputs at future stages.

## Person and Family Engagement

Involving persons and family representatives in the measure development process is one of the many ways that CMS strives to accomplish its goal of strengthening person and family engagement as partners in their care<sup>2</sup>. As used here, the term *person* refers to a non-healthcare professional representing those who receive healthcare. *Family representatives* are other non-healthcare professionals supporting those who receive healthcare, such as caregivers.

A variety of engagement techniques are available to measure developers. Specific techniques and best practices for their implementation are discussed in detail in the [MMS Blueprint](#). Regardless of the engagement methods developers use, it is critical that they provide person and family representatives with clear expectations

about what their participation in measure development activities will entail.

Prior to measure conceptualization, measure developers should create a plan outlining how they will incorporate person and/or family representative input at each stage of the measure lifecycle. Developers should involve persons and/or family representatives as early as possible to ensure their perspectives are captured adequately.

### Now Open! JIRA MUC Project 2018

JIRA is now open to collect candidate measures for the CMS 2018 Measures under Consideration (MUC) List. If you are an authorized user of the 2017 or prior years' JIRA web interface for the MUC List, you should have access to the new 2018 MUC Project.

New candidate measures for most CMS programs will be accepted until June 15, 2018. If you have a **quality** measure for Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS), the last day to submit your measure in JIRA is June 1, 2018.
