Impact Assessment of CMS Quality and Efficiency Measures

## Dates:

A two-day joint meeting of the Technical Expert Panel (TEP) and the Federal Assessment Steering Committee (FASC) will be held in early May 2019 in Baltimore, Maryland.

## **Project Overview:**

Section 1890A(a)(6) of the Social Security Act (the Act)) requires that the Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS) conduct an assessment of the quality and efficiency impact of endorsed measures used in the Medicare programs, as described in section 1890(b)(7)(B) of the Act. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has released a comprehensive report every three years, beginning with the first report in March 2012.

CMS contracted with Health Services Advisory Group, Inc. (HSAG) as part of the Measure & Instrument Development and Support (MIDS) Contract (contract number HHSM-500-2013-13007I; HHSM-500-T0002) to conduct the triennial assessment and report the findings to the public in the 2018 National Impact Assessment of CMS Quality Measures Report (2018 Impact Assessment Report). As part of its measure development process, CMS asks measure developers to convene groups of stakeholders and experts who contribute direction and thoughtful input to the measure developer during measure development and maintenance. HSAG is convening a technical expert panel (TEP) of stakeholders and experts to provide input on the development of the fourth triennial Impact Assessment Report, scheduled for release in 2021. The following individuals were selected and have agreed to serve as the TEP for this project.
