How to Identify and Recruit Test Sites for Electronic Clinical Quality Measures (eQMs)

Testing is important for measure development. It helps to make sure that quality measures are feasible, scientifically sound, and usable. Like other measures, eQMs are tested in two phases:

- **Alpha testing:** measure developers find test sites to give feedback about the feasibility and face validity of a measure. They also share ideas to improve the measure specifications.
- **Beta testing:** measure developers usually collect patient-level data related to the eQM. This data is used to assess the measure's scientific acceptability (validity and reliability) and feasibility.


It is recommended that measure developers work with test sites to collect data on their measures for both phases of testing. However, identifying and recruiting test sites can be a challenge. For beta testing in particular, site recruitment can be time-consuming and expensive. For these reasons, it is important to think carefully about the necessary test site characteristics and focus a recruitment plan on identifying sites that meet those requirements.

CMIT: Measure Summary Tab

There are approximately 38 programs with over 2,200 measures in the Measures Inventory. Some measures may be associated with multiple CMS programs. By selecting the “Measure Summary” tab, you can find out how many measures are in each of the CMS programs:

1. Click on “Measure Summary” tab located near the top of the Measures Inventory page.



2. The results will show the number of measures associated with each CMS program categorized by measure status. A single measure can have different statuses across programs (e.g. one program may have proposed the measure while another program may keep it as considered). Maximize your window screen to make sure that you can view each column.
3. To see all the measures associated with a program, click on the program name. Keep in mind that the status of a measure in one program may differ from the status of that same measure in another program. You can also see measures within a program by status if you click on the number below the status column (considered, declined, etc) for the row of the interested program.

Version 14.1 updates the deliverables and requirements to align with the 2018 Measure and Instrument Development and Support (MIDS) Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract. Additionally, a link and information about the Clinical Quality Language Style Guide was added to the electronic clinical quality measure (eCQM) Standards-Based Guidance and Tools chapter and all references to the ONC Issues Tracking System (JIRA) were changed to ONC Project Tracking System (JIRA).
