NOTE: The only impact of this errata document to XML submitters is the size of the XML file. Nothing has changed with regard to XML format, other than what was already communicated in the V2.00.0 PBJ Data Submission Specifications, which were posted in January 2016.

This maximum size has not changed; however, a new limit has been added for the size of a submitted XML file: it must not be larger than 50 MB.	<p>The fourth sentence in the second paragraph of the Introduction section in the Overview document (on page 1) will be revised as follows:</p> <p>The maximum size for a ZIP file that the PBJ system can accept is 5 MB, and the maximum size for a XML file within the ZIP file is 50 MB.</p>	This change will be made in the next version of the PBJ Data Submission Specifications.
02	The Overview document should reference the PBJ Policy Manual for information on how the value of the item "hours" should be determined.	<p>The following bullet will be added to the end of Section 8 within the Overview document:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Please refer to the PBJ Policy Manual for information on determining the value of the item "hours" for a specific "jobTitleCode" on a specific "date." 	This change will be made in the next version of the PBJ Data Submission Specifications.

03	<p>In Appendix B of the Overview document, there is an issue with the row for Job Title Code 13 (Nurse Practitioner). The Labor Description for "Nurse Practitioner" should be Physician Services (not Nursing Services, as stated).</p>	<p>Appendix B of the Overview document will be corrected to display "Physician Services" as the Labor Description for Job Title Code 13.</p>	<p>This change will be made in the next version of the PBJ Data Submission Specifications.</p>
04	<p>In Section 9 of the Overview document (XML File Structure) it is stated that XML files must employ ASCII character encoding. It should also be noted that only standard ASCII characters are supported. Extended ASCII characters should not be used.</p>	<p>The first paragraph of Section 9 of the Overview document shall be revised to read as follows:</p> <p>As noted above, PBJ data is collected using XML files. XML files must employ <u>standard</u> ASCII character encoding. Extended ASCII characters are not supported. Figure 1, below, shows how PBJ XML submission files MUST be structured.</p>	<p>This change will be made in the next version of the PBJ Data Submission Specifications.</p>

05	<p>For the item Hours, the description “hours worked” was removed from the text of edit -4015. However, the item description for Hours was not revised in the same manner. The item description for Hours reads incorrectly as follows:</p> <p>Hours worked for jobTitleCode on date</p>	<p>The item description for Hours will be revised to read as follows:</p> <p>Hours for jobTitleCode on date</p> <p>The PBJ Data Specifications database will be revised accordingly, and the change will be seen on the PBJ Data Submission Specs report for the Staffing section, as well as the PBJ Data Submission Specs report for Unduplicated Edits By ID.</p>	<p>This change will be made in the next version of the PBJ Data Submission Specifications.</p>

The submitted value must match the facilityId in the PBJ System for the facility or provider.</p> <p>b) A user submitting a file for a provider must be authorized to submit for the provider identified by the FAC_ID item in the file.</p> <p>However, this edit is triggered not only when a valid facilityId cannot be found, but also when a CMS Certification Number (CCN) is not present in the CMS database for the submitted facilityId. Therefore, the text of the edit must be revised to provide that information,</p>	<p>Edit -3693 will be revised to read as follows:</p> <p>facilityId is the facility/provider ID. CCN is the CMS Certification Number.</p> <p>a) The facilityId must be assigned to the provider. The state agency assigns the facilityId to nursing homes. The submitted value must match the facilityId in the PBJ System for the facility or provider. There is no CCN in the CMS database. Your file cannot be saved until there is a valid CCN entered. Once the CCN is entered, please resubmit this submission. Contact your facility Administrator to work with your state to enter the CCN once it is assigned by CMS.</p> <p>b) A user submitting a file for a provider must be authorized to submit for the provider identified by the FAC_ID item in the file. A valid CCN is also required for authorization.</p>	<p>This change will be made in the next version of the PBJ Data Submission Specifications.</p>
