Sharon K. Inouye, MD, MPH, developer/presenter, is board certified in general internal medicine and geriatric medicine, and trained in clinical epidemiology and biostatistics. Dr. Inouye's research interests include the epidemiology and outcomes of delirium and functional decline in older persons, reversible contributors to cognitive decline with aging, the interrelationship of delirium and dementia, and improving measurement methods of cognition. She developed the Confusion Assessment Method (CAM), the most widely used method for delirium identification;

and the Hospital Elder Life Program (HELP) for delirium prevention, which has been implemented in over 200 hospitals worldwide.

Dr. Inouye currently directs the Successful Aging after Elective Surgery (SAGES) study, a large Program Project from the National Institute on Aging exploring innovative risk factors and long term outcomes of delirium. She established the Center of Excellence for Delirium in Aging: Research, Training and Educational Enhancement (CEDARTREE). She has mentored over 90 students, fellows, and faculty in clinical research and aging.

Dr. Inouye earned a Doctor of Medicine degree at the University of California, San Francisco and a Master of Public Health degree at Yale University.
