

## 2014 Group Practice Measure Crosswalk

If your group practice reported any of the following 2014 PQRS measures via Web Interface, your group’s performance scores will be publicly reported on Physician Compare in late 2015. Quality measure data are displayed on Physician Compare in plain language. The performance rates are displayed as stars and percentages. The plain language measure titles, descriptions, and display are tested with consumers to ensure that they are accurately interpreted.

This document provides a crosswalk between the technical measure title and the plain language measure title that will appear on Physician Compare.

<b>Preventive Care: General Health</b>		
PREV-7	Influenza Immunization	Getting a flu shot during flu season.
PREV-8	Pneumococcal Vaccination Status for Older Adults	Making sure older adults have gotten a pneumonia vaccine.
PREV-12	Screening for Clinical Depression and Follow-Up Plan	Screening for depression and developing a follow-up plan.
PREV-10	Tobacco Use: Screening and Cessation Intervention	Screening for tobacco use and providing help quitting when needed.
PREV-9	Body Mass Index (BMI) Screening and Follow-Up	Screening for an unhealthy body weight and developing a follow-up plan.
PREV-11	Screening for High Blood Pressure and Follow-Up Documented	Screening for high blood pressure and developing a follow-up plan.
<b>Preventive Care: Cancer Screening</b>		
PREV-5	Breast Cancer Screening	Screening for breast cancer.
PREV-6	Colorectal Cancer Screening	Screening for colorectal (colon or rectum) cancer.
<b>Patient Safety</b>		
CARE-1	Medication Reconciliation	Comparing new and old medications.
<b>Diabetes</b>		
DM-13	High Blood Pressure Control	Controlling blood pressure in patients with diabetes.
DM-16	Daily Aspirin or Antiplatelet Medication Use for Patients with Diabetes and Ischemic Vascular Disease	Using aspirin or prescription medicines to reduce heart attacks and strokes in patients with diabetes.
<b>Heart Disease</b>		
HF-6	Beta-Blocker Therapy for Left Ventricular Systolic Dysfunction (LVSD)	Patients with heart failure and a weakened pumping chamber of the heart who got a beta blocker.
CAD-7	Angiotensin-Converting Enzyme (ACE) Inhibitor or Angiotensin Receptor Blocker (ARB) Therapy - Diabetes or Left Ventricular Systolic Dysfunction	Prescribing medicine to improve the pumping action of the heart in patients who have both heart disease and certain other conditions.
IVD-2	Use of Aspirin or Another Antithrombotic	Using aspirin or prescription medicines to reduce heart attacks and strokes.
