Consultation with Tribe concerning the SPA: The Department sent letters to the seven federally-

recognized Tribes in Montana, Tribal Health Departments, Social Service Directors, and Urban Center Director on January 27, 2011 that described potential approaches to consultation and reminded recipients of the February 3, 2011 meeting. Two meetings, one held on February 3, 2011 and a second held February 22, 2011, addressed the consultation options. This process led to the adoption of the

option described above.
