will be made when a reduction of one million dollars or more, all funds, is proposed for a program or State Plan category. The SPA indicates that Medicaid staff will hold regular conference calls with designees from the three federally-recognized Tribes in Texas and

Urban Inter-Tribal Center of Texas (UITCT).

Length of Time for Notification: 30 days prior to submission.

Process for Seeking Expedited Advice: Not specified.

Length of Time for Expedited Notification: 7 days prior to submission.

Consultation with Tribe concerning the SPA: The State Medicaid agency staff met face-to-face with

the health service designees of the federallyrecognized Tribes and UITCT. The Kickapoo Traditional Tribe of Texas did not send a

representative to the meeting, and on May 21, 2010, the State Medicaid staff discussed in a conference call

the potential consultation process with a tribal designee. When the State sent the draft consultation policy to each Indian health program and urban

Indian organization, no changes were suggested, and all parties subsequently signed a tribal consultation

agreement form.
