Inclusiveness: The SPA describes consultation with the tribal governments, IHS, and Urban

Indian Organization.

Process for Seeking Advice: The Utah Department of Health (UDOH) and Utah Medicaid use an

established model with three components to seek advice. It includes the UDOH Tribal Consultation Policy, not defined in the SPA, which is the framework for how the parties communicate regarding all health issues; a monthly meeting of the Utah Indian Health Advisory Board (UIHAB), which is comprised of appointed health representatives from all seven tribal governments, IHS, and the Urban Indian Organization; and the UDOH Indian Health Liaison who provides administrative and facilitative services. The UIHAB has standing agenda items for Medicaid and CHIP. If the UIHAB or any individual Tribe feels the need for further consultation on an issue, a formal meeting is scheduled to address the issue. The Indian Health Liaison reports quarterly on policies and business that impact

tribal and Urban Indian communities.
