- **Program Transmittals** – After clicking on the link for the specific year that the Program Transmittal was published, review the list of Transmittals to find the appropriate document.
- **Crosswalks** – After clicking on the link for a specific type of crosswalk, review the list to find the appropriate document.
- **Paper-Based-Manuals** – After clicking on the Paper-Based Manuals link, review the list of publications to find the appropriate document.
- **Program Memoranda** – After clicking on the link for the specific year that the Program Memorandum was published, review the list of Memoranda to find the appropriate document.

#### **Can I Locate a Specific Section in an Internet-Only Manual if I Know Where the Section Is in the Paper-Based Manual?**

CMS developed crosswalks to assist you in locating materials in the Internet-Only Manuals, based on the location in the Paper-Based Manuals. Crosswalks have been created for the: Medicare Carriers Manual, Medicare Intermediary Manual, and Provider Manuals.




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# **The CMS Online Manual System**

*A Web-based Manual System  
for Providers, Contractors,  
and State Agencies*



### What Is the CMS Online Manual System?

The CMS Online Manual System currently consists of six parts: (1) The Internet-Only Manuals (IOMs), (2) Future IOM Updates, (3) Program Transmittals, (4) Crosswalks, (5) Paper-Based Manuals, and (6) Program Memoranda. These products are CMS program issuances, day-to-day operating instructions, policies, and procedures that are based on statutes, regulations, guidelines, models, and directives. They provide comprehensive guidance, clarification, and explanation of the statutes and regulations. These instructions are located on the CMS Online Manual System at [www.cms.hhs.gov/manuals](http://www.cms.hhs.gov/manuals) and are a replica of the official record copy.

### What Are the Benefits of the CMS Online Manual System?

The CMS Online Manual System offers providers and contractors, as well as CMS, several benefits:

- A centralized location for Medicare and Medicaid policies, available 24 hours a day;
- A single source of information for the Medicare and Medicaid programs;
- A significant elimination of redundancy and a streamlining of the update process (due to the functional orientation of the system); and
- A more timely and accessible fashion for accessing CMS program instructions.

### How Will I Be Notified of Program Instructions?

CMS will notify Medicare contractors of new and changed program instructions through the [cms.hhs.gov](http://cms.hhs.gov) website. Providers will be notified through their servicing contractor's website and provider bulletins.

The CMS Quarterly Provider Update provides advance notification of all new and changed program instructions. Providers may subscribe to it at [www.cms.hhs.gov/providerupdate/main.asp](http://www.cms.hhs.gov/providerupdate/main.asp) on the CMS website.

### How Is the CMS Online Manual System Organized?

The CMS Online Manual System is organized by functional areas, such as:

- Eligibility and Entitlement;
- Claims Processing; and
- Benefit Policy.

### What Are the Specific Functional Areas?

There are 21 functional areas within the CMS Online Manual System, as shown in the following table:

### In What File Format Will the Electronic Files Be Presented?

Electronic manual files will be provided in Microsoft Word, and Adobe's Portable Document Format (PDF). PDF files can be viewed using the Adobe Acrobat Reader, a free program available from Adobe Systems.

### How Is the CMS Online Manual System Website Organized?

The CMS Online Manual System website contains six subsections:

- **Internet-Only Manuals (IOMs)** – Manuals that have been transitioned to the Internet-Only format;
- **Future IOM Updates** – Future updates to the IOMs, organized by effective/implementation dates on a quarterly basis;
- **Program Transmittals** – Transmittals that are organized by year of publication;
- **Crosswalks** – Information on where material from the Paper-Based Manuals was incorporated in the IOMs;
- **Paper-Based-Manuals** – Used only for reference purposes; and
- **Program Memoranda** – Organized by year of publication and used only for reference.

As CMS updates manual instructions, revised materials will be updated into the Internet-Only Manuals on the implementation date of the instruction. The current policy and future policy for the Medicare and Medicaid programs are contained in the IOM, future updates to the IOM and the transmittal page on the CMS Online Manual System which is updated weekly.

### How Can I Locate Materials in Each of the Six Subsections?

Since each subsection is organized differently, the process for locating the different types of documents is different:

- **Internet-Only Manuals (IOMs)** – After clicking on the Internet-Only Manuals (IOMs) link, review the Table of Contents to locate the appropriate
