### Fundamentals of Hospital Medicine - AAPA

**Date:** January 11 - 15, 2010

**Location:** Temple, TX

The AAPA and Scott & White Hospital announces the second annual hospital/critical care medicine symposium and workshop. This 5-day course is based on the core competency standards set by the Society of Hospital Medicine.
