

Every year, vaccination saves the lives of 2.5 million children and protects over 100 million more from illness and disability.

CDC subject matter expert, Iyabode Akinsanya-Beysolow, MD, MPH will discuss the most recent Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommendations for pediatric and adult vaccinations. This presentation will include information on newer vaccines and administration schedules and resources to aid in developing administration protocols that foster the promotion of childhood and adult immunizations in provider practices.


