Section 50203 of the BBA of 2018





Overview

- Extends certain ground ambulance add-on payments through December 31, 2022
- Ground Ambulance Providers and Suppliers must submit cost and other information
 - CMS must collect cost, revenue, utilization, and other information determined appropriate by the Secretary
 - Needed to evaluate the extent to which reported costs relate to payment rates;
 - On the utilization of capital equipment and ambulance capacity; and
 - On different types of ground ambulance services furnished in different geographic locations.
- Specify data collection system and who must report for the first year by December 31, 2019
 - Use representative sample of ground ambulance provider and supplier types and geographic locations
 - Will not include an individual provider or supplier in the sample in 2 consecutive years, to extent practicable
- 10 percent payment reduction for failure to report
 - May exempt provider or supplier from payment reduction due to significant hardship, such as natural disaster, bankruptcy
 - Establish an informal review process





Overview Continued

- Medicare Payment Advisory Commission must assess information submitted by providers and suppliers, the adequacy of payments for ground ambulance services, and geographic variations in cost, and submit a Report to Congress
 - Analysis of information submitted through the data collection system
 - Analysis of provider and supplier burden associated with the data collection system
 - Recommend whether to continue to keep or revise the data collection system
 - Other information the Commission determines appropriate
- Public Availability –CMS must post information on the results of data collection to the CMS website
- as determined appropriate by the Secretary
- Implement through notice and comment rulemaking
