Important Medicare Dates

November 15 – Open Enrollment Begins

Enroll as soon as possible – the sooner the better – to avoid any inconvenience at the pharmacy counter in January.

December 31 – Open Enrollment Ends
Medicare's Open Enrollment ends on December 31. The next Open Enrollment period will begin on November 15, 2007.
