SUBJECT: Termination of Multi-Payer Advance Primary Care Practice (MAPCP) Demonstration in Minnesota and Pennsylvania

I. SUMMARY OF CHANGES: The purpose of this CR is to provide instruction for handling MAPCP Demonstration claims after December 31, 2014 in Pennsylvania and Minnesota.

The MAPCP Demonstration is ending effective December 31, 2014 in Minnesota and Pennsylvania. The demonstration will continue to operate after January 1, 2015 in the remaining six states (Maine, Vermont, New York, Rhode Island, North Carolina, and Michigan). Claims for providers in these states shall continue to be processed and paid for dates of service after January 1, 2015 in accordance with previous guidance.

IMPLEMENTATION DATE: January 5, 2015

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Background: On February 11, 2011, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued Change Request (CR) 7283, *Implementation Support and Payment Processing for the Multi-payer Advanced Primary Care Practice (MAPCP) Demonstration*. This CR was implemented with the October 2011 release. Subsequent CRs and TDLs amended various business requirements.

The original CR stated that the demonstration would run for 36 months in each state with a staggered start date in different states. The actual start dates were July 1, 2011 (for Vermont, New York and Rhode Island), October 1, 2011 (for Minnesota and North Carolina) and January 1, 2012 (for Pennsylvania, Michigan and Maine) and thus the originally scheduled end dates varied.

On April 18, 2014, CMS issued CR 8719 extending this demonstration at least through December 31, 2014 for all eight participating states.

CMS has decided to end the MAPCP Demonstration in Pennsylvania and Minnesota effective December 31, 2014. The demonstration will continue in the remaining six states. This CR provides instructions for handling MAPCP Demonstration claims after December 31, 2014.

B. Policy: CMS has decided to end the MAPCP Demonstration in Pennsylvania and Minnesota effective December 31, 2014. The demonstration will continue in the remaining six states.

MAPCP Demonstration claims for providers in Pennsylvania and Minnesota should not be processed for dates of service on or after January 1, 2015. MAPCP Demonstration claims for providers in Maine, Vermont, New York, Rhode Island, North Carolina and Michigan should continue to be processed for service dates after January 1, 2015 and until such time as the contractors and system maintainers are notified that the demonstration is over in those states.
