CMS will review the estimates and determine the feasibility to install updates for the October 2010 CEM software release.

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Background: This Change Request (CR) is to instruct the CEM developers to analyze the current environment of the CEM software in order to provide an estimate of costs associated to update the CEM environment for the purposes of processing Interchange data that contain the value for either "Test" or "Prod" in the ISA15 data element. CMS shall review the estimates and determine the feasibility to install updates for the October 2010 CEM software release.

A/B Medicare Administrative Contractors (MACs) and the Durable Medical Equipment (DME) Common Electronic Data Interchange (CEDI) contractor shall advise CMS through the CR POC comments of any issues specific to their local environment which need to be addressed to accomplish the processing of "Test" or "Prod" data in the single environment.

In order to meet the CMS scheduled date for Level II compliance as defined in the January 2009 Final Rule on Transactions and Code Set Modification, additional requirements outside of the CEM software processing environment are being addressed, specifically as it relates to the scrubbing process for outbound data exiting the Enterprise Data Center (EDC) prior to delivery to the Local Data Center (LDC).

This CR provides direction to the following stakeholders:
