I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Background: The purpose of this change request is to notify all interested parties that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) needs to change the contractor workload numbers for the Part A and Part B workloads in the States of Kentucky and Ohio as well as the workload number of the Regional Home Health Intermediary workload for region “B” when those workloads are transitioned to the J15 A/B MAC. These changes are being made because CMS needs to identify each workload by state. These workloads will be transitioned to the J15 A/B MAC as indicated below.

The effective date of all Part A transitions will fall on Monday, but the effective dates of the Part B transitions will fall on a Saturday. This is necessary to accommodate the software that will be used to create and populate the new Part B CICS production regions.

The Ohio Part B workload is currently processed in the same CICS region as the West Virginia Part B workload. In order to accomplish this transition, CMS will need to split these workloads into two different sets of CICS regions. CMS will simultaneously transition the West Virginia Part B workload to the J11 A/B MAC as per CR 7203.

The Kentucky Part B workload is currently processed in the same CICS region as the Indiana Part B workload. In order to accomplish this transition, CMS will need to split these workloads into two different sets of CICS regions. The Indiana Part B workload will remain with National Government Services (NGS), the legacy contractor that is currently processing that workload.
