## Promoting Interoperability Program Stage 3 Objectives and Measures for 2018

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Eligible Hospital and Critical Access Hospital Objectives and Measures	
(1)	<a href="#">Protect electronic protected health information</a> created or maintained by the certified electronic health record technology (CEHRT) through the implementation of appropriate technical, administrative, and physical safeguards.
(2)	Generate and transmit permissible discharge <a href="#">prescriptions electronically</a> .
(3)	Implement <a href="#">clinical decision support</a> interventions focused on improving performance on high-priority health conditions.
(4)	Use <a href="#">computerized provider order entry</a> for medication, laboratory, and diagnostic imaging orders directly entered by any licensed health care professional, credentialed medical assistant, or a medical staff member credentialed to and performing the equivalent duties of a credentialed medical assistant, who can enter orders into the medical record per state, local, and professional guidelines.
(5)	<a href="#">Patient Electronic Access</a> - The eligible hospital or critical access hospital (CAH) provides patients (or patient authorized representative) with timely electronic access to their health information and patient-specific education.
(6)	<a href="#">Coordination of Care</a> - Use CEHRT to engage with patients or their authorized representatives about the patient's care.
(7)	<a href="#">Health Information Exchange</a> - The eligible hospital or CAH provides a summary of care record when transitioning or referring their patient to another setting of care, receives or retrieves a summary of care record upon the receipt of a transition or referral or upon the first patient encounter with a new patient, and incorporates summary of care information from other providers into their EHR using the functions of CEHRT.
(8)	<a href="#">Public Health Reporting</a> - The eligible hospital or CAH is in active engagement with a public health agency or clinical data registry to submit electronic public health data in a meaningful way using CEHRT, except where prohibited, and in accordance with applicable law and practice.
