

Minutes of the
DESY Customer Meeting
Held at CMS, October 25, 2005

Opening Statement

Barbara Roth ran the meeting and provided the following highlights:

Operations

- o Status of DESY request processing:
- o Stats are looking good.
- o There are no requests over 30 days in the system.

- o Walt Dunick discussed the upcoming migration from the FTAPE system to the DADSS application. He will present a more detailed presentation at next month's meeting but wanted to present the following highlights:
- o The transition to the new system is targeted for Dec/Jan.
- o DADSS is an acronym for Data Agreement and Data Shipping System.
- o There will be a new GUI front end and the DADSS system will comply with the CMS 3 zone architecture.
- o Compliant with HIPPA.
- o Uses Role Based Access.
- o DADSS has improved reporting capabilities.
- o Recipient ID will be converted to Recipient Address ID. There will be a published list of the converted values.
- o Recipient Address IDs need to be added to the DUA before a DESY job can be created for that DUA.
- o DADSS will require users to have Internet Explorer v6.0.
- o Only open DUAs and active orders containing Files will be converted initially.
- o History will remain in the FTAPE system for tracking purposes.
- o The FTAPE step will require new parameters.
- o There will be onsite training at CMS in December as well as video conference training.

- o Due to the DADSS deployment, DESY will need to make changes.
- o It is estimated that DESY will be unavailable for a period of 1 week while the DESY jobs are flushed out of the system and the new release is installed. Users will be notified prior to the implementation.
- o The DESY Distribution Screen will be modified to include a drop down box that will list all of the valid Recipient Address IDs for the selected DUA. These changes will largely impact users creating Foreign Media.

- o Barb mentioned that a production issue has been identified in DESY. It only occurs when the following options are chosen:
- o 1998-2005 NCH request
- o HICAN finder file

- o 'Dropped records option is set to 'NO'
- o View option is selected
- o Job was run after 8/15/2005 (V5.3 release)
- * If these options were chosen, and you have your DUA set to Identifiable data, you may have gotten Encrypted data.
- * We will identify all requests that may have been affected and the users will be notified.

Questions

Q: Steve Sullivan asked whom to contact with DESY questions?

A: Barb stated that he should send notes through the Comment Tracker. The entire team will receive the note.

Q: Someone from Tricenturion asked about the SAF data. They wanted to know which date is used to determine which year the claim belongs to.

A: Barb stated that she had received the question and she will respond to it sometime within the next day or so. **Update: Barb emailed the user that the 'claim thru date' is used to decide which SAF year the claim belongs to.

Q: Another user asked whether the encryption problem (stated above) would be addressed on the News & Information page?

A: Barb stated that affected requests will be identified, and the users will be contacted.
