This is a follow-up response to our letter to you dated October 13, 2017, regarding the California wildfires. You indicated that the California Hospital Association has been working closely with hospitals adversely affected by the wildfires in northern California.

On October 15, 2017, Acting Secretary Eric D. Hargan declared that a public health emergency exists and has existed since October 8, 2017, in the State of California, as a consequence of the California wildfires. With respect to Medicare Part A coverage for post-acute skilled nursing facility (SNF) care, CMS has approved a blanket waiver of the Social Security Act, Section 1812(f). This waiver of the requirement for a 3-day prior hospitalization for coverage of a SNF Part A stay provides temporary emergency coverage of SNF services without a qualifying hospital stay, for those people who are evacuated, transferred, or otherwise dislocated as a result of the effect of the wildfires in California in 2017. In addition, for certain beneficiaries who recently exhausted their SNF benefits, it authorizes renewed SNF coverage without first having to start a new benefit period. Individual facilities do not need to apply for this blanket waiver.
