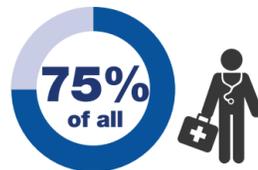
Medicare & Medicaid EHR Incentive Programs

How EHRs advance health care:

EHRs reduce errors, improve patient safety, support better patient outcomes, and help providers diagnose patients' problems sooner.

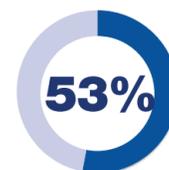

How ACOs advance health care:

ACOs aim to provide patients with the right care at the right time, while avoiding unnecessary duplication of services and preventing medical errors.

Physician Quality Reporting System (PQRS)

How PQRS advances health care:

PQRS data helps patients make informed decisions about their health care. They will have access to the quality of care information of their providers through the CMS Physician Compare website.

test claims were accepted by CMS.

Nationally, CMS accepted 89 percent of the test claims, with some regions reporting acceptance rates as high as 99 percent. Testing did not identify any issues with the Medicare FFS claims systems. Results also include claims where testers intentionally included errors to test rejection, a process known as negative validation.

How ICD-10 advances health care:

ICD-10 codes will provide better support for patient care. By enabling more detailed patient history coding, ICD-10 can help to better coordinate a patient's care across providers and over time.

Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)

 **Progress to date ...**



In January 2014, more than
8 million

health care payments were made using EFT through the Automated Clearing House Network.



32%

increase in EFT transactions in the first quarter of 2014 from the fourth quarter of 2013.



claim submission transactions were conducted electronically in 2012.

How EFT advances health care:

EFT creates efficiencies in payment processing, including paper reduction, decreased risk of lost or stolen paper checks, quicker access to funds, and easier payment reconciliation.
