Dear Acting Commissioner McDonald:

Thank you for your submission on May 12, 2023, of New York's application for a State Innovation Waiver under section 1332 of the Affordable Care Act (ACA). New York's application seeks to waive certain ACA requirements to create a new coverage program that generally mirrors the State's Essential Plan¹ and to expand eligibility for that new coverage program to certain residents with incomes up to 250% of the Federal Poverty Level who would otherwise be eligible for subsidized coverage on the Marketplace for plan years 2024 through 2028. I am pleased to send this letter from the Center for Consumer Information and Insurance Oversight (CCIIO) within the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) under the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), as well as on behalf of the Department of the Treasury (collectively, the Departments). The Departments have completed a preliminary review of the application in accordance with 45 C.F.R. § 155.1308(c) and 31 C.F.R. § 33.108(c), and have made a preliminary determination that New York's application is complete.

Pursuant to 45 C.F.R. § 155.1308(d) and 31 C.F.R. § 33.108(d), the date of this letter marks the beginning of the Federal public notice and comment process and 180-day Federal decision-making period. Public comments on New York's waiver application will be accepted by the Departments from June 6, 2023 through July 5, 2023, and more information about the Federal public notice and comment process and section 1332 waivers generally can be found on the CCIIO website.<sup>2</sup> The decision of the Departments regarding approval or denial of New York's waiver application will be issued within 180 days of this preliminary determination of completeness in accordance with 45 C.F.R. § 155.1316(c), 31 C.F.R. § 33.116(c), and other applicable regulations.

We look forward to working with you on your waiver application and will be in touch if we need additional information. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any questions.

If its section 1332 waiver proposal is approved, New York will seek to suspend its existing BHP and seamlessly transition that population to its new section 1332 waiver program.
