MDS 3.0 QM User's Manual Version 14.0 Now Available

MDS 3.0 Item Sets Version 1.17.2 and Related Technical Data Specifications Now Available

In response to State Medicaid Agency and stakeholder requests, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has updated the Minimum Data Set (MDS) 3.0 item sets (version 1.17.2) and related technical data specifications. These changes will support the calculation of Patient Driven Payment Model (PDPM) payment codes on Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (OBRA) assessments when not combined with the 5-day Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) Prospective Payment System (PPS) assessment, specifically the OBRA comprehensive (NC) and OBRA quarterly (NQ) assessment item sets, which was not possible with item set version 1.17.1. This will allow State Medicaid Agencies to collect and compare Resource Utilization Group (RUG)-III/IV payment codes to PDPM codes and thereby inform their future payment models.
