# Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) Regarding Decommissioning the Classic Direct Enrollment (DE) Pathway

These FAQs clarify the guidelines that DE Entities must follow to decommission their classic DE pathways.

## 1. Can enhanced direct enrollment (EDE) Entities access the classic DE pathway after 10/31/2025?

No. EDE Entities must decommission their classic DE pathways on or before 10/31/2025. Prospective and approved EDE Entities are not able to access the consumer-facing or agent/broker-facing classic DE pathways in test or production environments after 10/31/2025.

Please note, the current EDE program requirements for calendar year 2025 are defined in the *Third-party Auditor Operational Readiness Reviews for the Enhanced Direct Enrollment Pathway and Related Oversight Requirements* (published April 16, 2025) (EDE Guidelines). CMS intends to release updated EDE Guidelines for calendar year 2026 audit submissions. Accordingly, prospective and approved EDE Entities should continue to review the *Direct Enrollment and Enhanced Direct Enrollment* CMS webpage<sup>2</sup> for updated guidance documents.

Entities operating Phase 2 EDE pathways must refer consumers to the Marketplace Call Center or HealthCare.gov when they encounter scenarios that their Phase 2 platform cannot support. These Entities will no longer have the option to redirect consumers to the classic DE pathway.

## 2. Can prospective Entities still apply for approval to use the classic DE pathway before 10/31/2025?

No. CMS is no longer onboarding prospective Entities to the classic DE pathway. Entities are only eligible to be considered for approval to use the EDE pathway.

3. How can a prospective Entity or an Entity that was only approved to use the classic DE pathway participate in the EDE program after the classic DE pathway is decommissioned?

As described in the EDE Guidelines, there are a number of options available to use EDE to assist consumers with completing an Exchange eligibility application and enrolling in a qualified health plan (QHP). At a high level, Entities may seek approval to participate in the EDE program as a:

- a. Primary EDE Entity that has developed its own EDE environment;
- b. Upstream EDE Entity leveraging an approved primary EDE Entity's EDE environment:
- c. Downstream agent/broker using an approved primary or upstream EDE Entity's EDE environment

Please note, some of these options may require developing a technical platform to interface with the Exchange, implementing and documenting privacy and security controls, and submitting documentation to CMS—including third-party audits—prior to being approved.
