**Title** Suspension of the laboratory's CLIA Certificate and Cancellation of Medicare

**Academic Alliance in Dermatology, Inc., 10D2215918**

On **April 25, 2026**, the laboratory's CLIA certificate, located at 6600 University Parkway, Ste 302, Sarasota, FL 34240, will be **suspended** due to their failure to meet CLIA requirements. In addition, the laboratory's approval to receive Medicare payments will be canceled.

The laboratory was notified on **April 10, 2026**.

When a laboratory's CLIA certificate is **suspended**, it is required to cease all patient laboratory testing, including waived and provider-performed microscopy testing, regardless of whether or not the laboratory charges for the testing. The laboratory may continue to perform parallel testing on specimens if needed to implement corrective actions; however, the laboratory may not report any test results during the period of suspension.

CMS is committed to patient safety and quality of care.
