**Title**                      **Limitation of CLIA Certificate**

On **June 19, 2026**, the laboratory's CLIA certificate, located at **200 Doctors Drive, Suite N, Douglas, GA 31533** will be **limited for the analytes of Total Iron Binding Capacity (TIBC) in the Subspecialty of Routine Chemistry and the analyte of Vitamin B12 (B12) in the Subspecialty of Endocrinology** due to their failure to meet CLIA requirements.

The laboratory was notified on **June 4, 2026**.

When a laboratory's CLIA certificate is **limited**, it will not be permitted to perform any testing for the purpose of providing information for the diagnosis, prevention, treatment of any disease or impairment of, or the assessment of the health of human beings, in the testing area where it is limited. The laboratory may continue to perform parallel testing on specimens if needed to implement corrective actions; however, the laboratory may not report any test results during the period of limitation.
