Hospice Quality Reporting Program (HQRP) – Important Reminders and Updates

Welcome!

<u>Calendar Year (CY) 2022 Data starts January 1, 2022 impacting fiscal year (FY) 2024</u> <u>payments---Be ready to meet your full Annual Payment Update (APU) to avoid the 4%</u> payment reduction

For hospices to meet the HQRP requirements in CY 2022, the Hospice must comply with the following: Hospice Item Set (HIS) submissions, the CAHPS® Hospice Survey requirements must be met and submitted timely each year. Data from CY 2022 will impact your APU for FY 2024.

Beginning with FY 2024, the payment penalty increases to 4% for hospices not meeting the HQRP Requirements. To ensure your hospice achieves its full APU, please be sure to meet the quality reporting requirements:

- For HIS: The threshold for HIS is 90%. This means that 90% of all HIS assessments must be submitted and accepted within 30 days of the admission or discharge date. For HIS, the quarters are based on submission of HIS admission or discharge assessments.
- For CAHPS: All Medicare-certified hospices that are required to conduct the CAHPS® Hospice Survey must contract with an approved CAHPS® Hospice Survey vendor and conduct the survey for 12 months in each calendar year. For CAHPS, the data collection quarters are based on patient deaths, January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, inclusive.
- **For Claims:** Administrative data is collected from claims, hospices are automatically considered 100% compliant with submission of this data.

Hurricane Ida Memo Available

Although the Hospice Quality Reporting Program is not granting automatic extensions or exemptions related to Hurricane Ida, CMS recognizes that some providers may have been affected by Hurricane Ida. If you are a HQRP provider that has an extraordinary or extenuating circumstance due to Hurricane Ida, please refer to the information below that is also discussed in more detail on the Extension and Exemption Requests webpage to find out about filing a timely extension or exemption request. The Hurricane Ida disaster specific memo can be found in the downloads section of the webpage.

Provider-initiated requests for exemption or extension for extraordinary circumstances, including Hurricane Ida: if a hospice provider experiences an extraordinary circumstance, they can initiate a request for extension or exemption. The request must be initiated within 90 days of the extraordinary circumstance event and it must be sent to CMS via email following the instructions provided on the Extension and Exemption Requests webpage.

Final Rule Updates

On July 29, 2021, CMS released the Fiscal Year 2022 Hospice Wage Index and Payment Rate Update, Hospice Conditions of Participation Updates, Requirements, and Home Health Quality Reporting Program Final Rule CMS-1754-F. View a <u>fact sheet</u> on the Final Rule or view the Final Rule in its entirety on the <u>Federal Register</u>. Below are some the of the key take aways:

- As a result of this rule, the HQRP will contain four quality measures that capture care
 across the hospice stay. These measures are being implemented as of October 1, 2021
 and they include, the Hospice and Palliative Care Composite Process Measure HIS
 Comprehensive Assessment at Admission (NQF #3235), Hospice Visits in Last Days of
 Life (HVLDL), the Hospice Care Index (HCI) and finally the measures calculated from
 the CAHPS® Hospice Survey (NQF #2651).
- This rule also finalized the addition of the Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS®) Hospice Survey Star ratings on Care Compare.
- Additionally, the rule finalized the addition of the claims-based measures: Hospice Visits in the Last Days of Life (HVLDL) and the Hospice Care Index (HCI) that will use eight

- quarters of data to report on more providers. These measures are targeted for May 2022 public reporting. These claims measures are included in your QM Report as of September 2021.
- Removal of the seven individual Hospice Item Set (HIS) measures as individual
 measures because a more broadly applicable measure, the Hospice Comprehensive
 Assessment Measure (NQF # 3235) is already in the program and shows variability.
 Please appreciate that NQF# 3235 requires the submission of the 7 HIS measures for the
 calculation of that composite measure. Consequently, the HIS Admission Record does
 not change.
 - The 7 HIS measures will no longer be publicly reported after February 2022. Their data will be publicly available on the Provider Data Catalog.
- We finalized that for the February 2022 refresh only, The HQRP will utilize less than the standard quarters of data for both HIS and CAHPS Hospice Survey data. For more information, please see the <u>FY 2022 Hospice Final Rule</u>.
- Finally, CMS provided updates regarding its development of a new Hospice Outcome and Patient Evaluation (HOPE) assessment instrument.

HQRP Updates

<u>Updated Provider Resource Documents Now Available on the HQRP Requirements and Best Practices Webpage</u>

To assist hospice providers, CMS has updated its webpages and documents based on the changes to the (FY) 2022 Hospice Final Rule. The updated documents include, *HQRP Requirements FY* 2023 and Future FY Reporting Years and the HQRP Quick Reference Guide FY 2023 can be found in the Downloads section, while the Getting Started with the HQRP can be found in the Toolkit section of the HQRP Requirements and Best Practices webpage.

Public Reporting Updates

November 2020-2021: Due to the temporary exemption to the HQRP data submission requirements in response to the COVID-19 PHE, public reporting of hospice data was frozen after the November 2020 refresh. Since the November 2020 refresh, CMS has been holding the publicly reported data constant through the November 2021 refresh. Further, CMS has not been issuing Provider Preview Reports for those refreshes that continue to display the constant or frozen data.

<u>February 2022 Refresh:</u> CMS will resume public reporting and Provider Preview Reports with the February 2022 refresh. Starting with the February 2022 refresh, CMS plans to resume public reporting with new data; but not the standard quarters of data, as discussed in the FY 2022 Hospice Final Rule.

This is the last refresh where we anticipate the 7 HIS measures and HIS-based Hospice Visits When Death is Imminent (HVWDII) will display. After February, data for the 7 HIS will be publicly available on the Provider Data Catalogue (PDC).

<u>May 2022 Refresh:</u> CMS is targeting the May 2022 refresh of Care Compare for the inaugural display of the two new claims-based QMs, HVLDL and HCI. For additional information, please refer to the <u>FY 2022 Hospice Final Rule</u> on the <u>Hospice Center webpage</u>.

Current Measures and the new Quality Measure (QM) Specifications User's Manual

Version 1.00 of the HQRP QM Specifications User's Manual and updated Current Measures document are now available. These documents detail the four HQRP measures that meet the HQRP requirements. They are the HIS Comprehensive Assessment at Admission (NQF# 3235); the claims-based Hospice Visits in the Last Days of Life; the claims-based Hospice Care Index; and the Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS®) Hospice Survey. CAHPS® Hospice Survey Update

The CAHPS Hospice Survey is continuing to collect data normally. Data submission deadlines for the CAHPS Data Warehouse are the second Wednesday of the month in February, May, August, and November. Please make sure to provide your vendor with your patient/caregiver lists in a timely manner in order to meet the requirements for the HQRP.

HOPE Update

HOPE beta testing begins at the end of November 2021 and lasts for several months. We will share updates on HOPE on future HQRP Forum calls throughout CY 2022.
