Policy Overview





What is the Purpose of the HPID?

- Required to be used in the standard transactions to identify a health plan that has an HPID
- Allowed to be used for any other lawful purpose





Who is Required to Get the HPID?

- Health plans as defined by 45 CFR 160.103
- Controlling health plan (CHP) vs. Subhealth plan (SHP)

Enumeration Requirements						
Entity	Enumeration Requirements	Enumerations Options				
CHPs	Must get an HPID for itself	 May get an HPID(s) for its SHP(s) May direct its SHP(s) to get HPID(s) 				
SHPs	Not required to get an HPID	 May get an HPID at the direction of its CHP May get an HPID of its own initiative 				





Controlling Health Plan

Controlling Health Plan (CHP):

- A CHP means a health plan that controls its own business activities, actions, or policies
 OR is controlled by an entity that is not a health plan; and
- If it has sub health plan(s) exercises sufficient control over the sub health plan(s) to direct its/their business activities, actions, or policies.



Subhealth Plan

Subhealth Plan (SHP):

 A SHP means a health plan whose business activities, actions, or policies are directed by a controlling health plan.

^{*} Small health plan means a health plan with annual receipts of \$5 million or less. (45 CFR 160.103)

What is the Other Entity Identifier?

- Voluntary Identifier
- Must meet following requirements:
 - Needs to be identified in the standard transactions
 - Is NOT eligible to obtain an NPI
 - Is NOT eligible to obtain an HPID
 - Is NOT an individual





Health Plan and **Other Entity** Enumeration System (HPOES)



HPOES

- HPID and OEID applications will be available through the Health Plan and Other Entity Enumeration System (HPOES) by the end of the first quarter of 2013.
- HPOES is housed within CMS' Health Insurance Oversight System (HIOS).

Overview of Application Process

Step 1: Register the Organization in HIOS

- To determine if the organization already exists in HIOS, search by the organization's Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN).
- If the organization does not already exist in HIOS, users will need to register their organization within HIOS.
- All registration requests are reviewed prior to approval.
- If the organization already exists in HIOS, users may proceed directly to step 2.



New HIOS Company Information





New HIOS Company Data Elements

- In order to register an organization, users must provide the following required information for a new HIOS Company:
 - Company Legal Name, Federal Employer Identification Number, Incorporated State, and Domiciliary Address

Overview of Application Process

- Step 2: Determine HPOES user role and request HIOS access to the company.
 - Users will need to determine their user role and identify the company they need access to. There are three different HPOES user roles:
 - Guest User: A user that is able to view general HPOES information.
 - **Submitter User:** A representative of a health plan or other entity that submits an application.
 - Authorizing Official User: A company executive that has the authority to approve applications, including CEOs and CFOs.

Overview of Application Process

Step 2 (Continued)

- If requesting the Submitter or Authorizing Official role, users will need to identify the company they wish to be granted access to.
- Users can only have access to one user role at a time.

Overview of Application Process

- Step 3: Access HPOES and select an application type
 - HPID Application
 - There are two different HPID application types:
 - CHP
 - SHP
 - If completing a SHP HPID application, users will be required to select a CHP company.
 - OEID Application

Overview of Application Process

Step 4: Complete and Submit an Application

- Users will need to complete their application and provide the necessary information.
- The company's Authorizing Official needs to be identified if one has not already been designated.
 - SHP applications will display the CHP's Authorizing Official information.
 - All Authorizing Official information provided in the application is reviewed prior to the user being assigned the Authorizing Official role.
- Users will be able to review their application information prior to submission.



 - Company Name, Federal Employer Identification Number, and Domiciliary Address
- Authorizing Official Information:
 - First and Last Name, Title, Phone Number, and Email Address
- The Health Plan's NAIC Number or Payer ID used in standard transactions


Subhealth Plan HPID Application

- All SHP applications require a user to identify the company's Controlling Health Plan.
 - In order for a company to be classified as a CHP Company, an HPID must be assigned to that company.
 - Users may search by CHP Company Name or the CHP's HPID Number.





 - Company Name, Federal Employer Identification Number, and Domiciliary Address
- Issuer's HIOS ID, Issuer Legal Name and State of Business
 - If the Issuer does not already exist in HIOS, users will first need to register the Issuer in HIOS.
- The Health Plan's NAIC Number or Payer ID used in standard transactions











Overview of Application Process

Step 5: Application Review

- Once the application has been submitted, the company's Authorizing Official will be notified that an application is pending their approval.
- The Authorizing Official will need to review each application and will have the option to approve or reject it.

Overview of Application Process

- Step 6: HPID or OEID Number Assigned
 - Once the application is approved by the Authorizing Official, the system will generate an HPID or OEID.
 - An email notification will be sent to the submitter user with the HPID or OEID generated.
