The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) External User Services (EUS) Help Desk assists with application navigation or access problems you may encounter while using Internet-based PECOS. This fact sheet provides contact information you can use if you encounter:

- A navigation problem that occurs when you are unable to determine how to use Internet-based PECOS.
- An access problem that occurs when Internet-based PECOS is not operating properly (for example, the website is not operational or is operating slowly, or a system-generated error message prevents data entry).

NOTE: A system-generated error message does not include messages created when you enter data incorrectly or ignore system prompts.

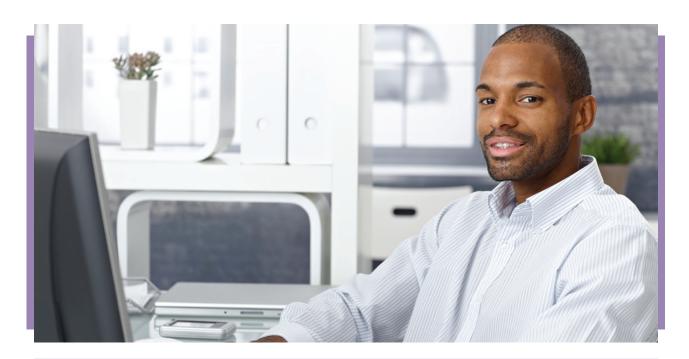
Who Should I Call?

- To report application, navigation, access, or printing problems with Internet-based PECOS, contact the CMS EUS Help Desk at 1-866-484-8049 (TTY 1-866-523-4759), or send an e-mail to EUSSupport@cgi.com.
- For help establishing a National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES) User ID and password, changing your password, or retrieving a forgotten User ID or password, contact the National Provider Identifier (NPI) Enumerator at 1-800-465-3203 (TTY 1-800-692-2326), or send an e-mail to customerservice@npienumerator.com.

NOTE: We recommend you change your NPPES password before accessing Internet-based PECOS for the first time and at least once a year thereafter. You cannot change your NPPES User ID.

- If you have a valid NPPES User ID and password, but are unable to access Internet-based PECOS, contact the CMS EUS Help Desk at 1-866-484-8049 or TTY 1-866-523-4759, or send an e-mail to EUSSupport@cgi.com.
- To ask a question about provider enrollment, contact your Medicare enrollment contractor.
