
Most beneficiaries had blood pressure and cholesterol screenings, regardless of individual characteristics




94% had a blood pressure screening



86% had a cholesterol screening







Fewer Medicare beneficiaries had a wellness visit and rates differed by individual characteristics

The MCBS is a nationally representative survey of Medicare beneficiaries sponsored by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and directed by the Office of Enterprise Data and Analytics (OEDA) of the CMS. The MCBS is authorized by section 1875 (42 USC 139511) of the Social Security Act and is conducted by NORC at the University of Chicago for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The OMB Number for this survey is 0938-0568. This communication was printed, published, or produced and disseminated at U.S. taxpayer expense.

Estimates are based on the 2020 Medicare Current Beneficiary Survey (MCBS) Preventive Care Public Use File (PUF) and represent the population of beneficiaries who were ever enrolled in Medicare in 2020 and completed an interview in Winter 2021 or Summer 2021. The dataset includes 14,086 beneficiaries (weighted N = 60,403,699). Overall screening rates may differ from subgroup averages due to varying subgroup sample sizes and may be lower than prior years due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
