

## Medicare COVID-19 Public Health Emergency Accelerated and Advance Payments Program Repayment Data

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services expanded its COVID-19 Accelerated and Advance Payment (CAAP) Program to increase cash flow to Medicare providers and suppliers impacted by the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) Public Health Emergency. These payments were funded from the Hospital Insurance (Part A) and Supplementary Medical Insurance (Part B) Trust Funds, which are the same funds used to pay Medicare claims each day. CAAPs are advances on claims payment amounts that providers and suppliers must pay back. In accordance with the *Continuing Appropriations Act, 2021 and Other Extensions Act* enacted on October 1, 2020, the tables below include information on the outstanding balances for the accelerated payments program and the advance payments program, and a breakout of repayments by provider and supplier type. Also displayed are the percentages of repayment made to the Federal Hospital Insurance Trust Fund and the Federal Supplementary Insurance Trust Fund, and the interest paid by program. **The data below reflects repayments made through and including May 31, 2022.**

### Interest Collected by Program

Please note, interest does not accrue on any payments owed under the COVID-19 Accelerated and Advance Payment program until 29 months from the date on which the payment was issued, after the outstanding balance is requested to be paid in full. During the CAAP recoupment period, CMS will not collect any interest on CAAPs. Once the demands for repayment are issued, after 29 months from the date on which payments were first issued (beginning in September of 2022), interest will start to accrue. The following chart contains data related to the dollar amount of interest that has been collected with respect to all payments under each program, prior to demands being issued this chart will reflect \$0.
