Background

CR 14041 is a maintenance update of ICD-10 conversions and other coding updates specific to National Coverage Determinations (NCDs). These NCD coding changes are the result of newly available codes, coding revisions to NCDs released separately, or coding feedback.

Translations from ICD-9 to ICD-10 aren't consistent 1-to-1 matches, nor are all ICD-10 codes appearing in a complete General Equivalence Mappings guide or other mapping guides appropriate when reviewed against individual NCD policies.

Relevant NCD coding changes in CR 14041 affect:

- NCD 20.9.1 – Ventricular assist devices
- NCD 110.24 – Chimeric antigen receptor T-cell therapy
- NCD 190.11 – Home prothrombin time/international normalized ratio monitoring for anticoagulation management
- NCD 210.4.1 – Counseling to prevent tobacco use
- NCD 210.13 – Screening for hepatitis C virus (HCV) in adults

Notes: NCD 110.24 has a new HCPCS code Q2058 effective July 1, 2025. This code describes a T-cell therapy obecabtagene autoleucel (obe-cel) treatment marketed as Aucatzyl®. HCPCS code C9301 describes this therapy for April 1, 2025 – June 30, 2025, dates of service.

For NCD 210.4.1, MACs are adding ICD-10-CM code Z72.0 effective October 1, 2024, to modify reason codes 59211, 59212, 59166, and 59167. This allows billing for HCPCS codes 99406 and 99407 with revenue code 0519 on Federally Qualified Health Center claims (type of bill (TOB) 77X).

For NCD 210.13, Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendment-waived laboratories should bill claims using HCPCS code G0567 with modifier QW for HCV screening in adults effective retroactive to FDA approval date of June 27, 2024. However, we deny HCV screening claims billed with G0567 or HCPCS code G0472 if submitted on TOBs other than 13X, 14X, or 85X, as well as claims with line items featuring G0472 or G0567 that don't include place of service codes 11, 19, 22, 49, 71, and 81.
