Redesign

Since its inception, the PBP software has played an integral part in the business operations of the MA and Part D programs. Beyond capturing the comprehensive benefit offerings for the annual bidding process, the PBP produces data that is used to support critical downstream activities, including, but not limited to, the following: beneficiary enrollment, plan payment, premium withhold, eligibility, appeals processing, production of the Medicare & You Handbook, and the Medicare Plan Finder (MPF) and Online Enrollment Center (OEC) applications on www.medicare.gov.

CMS is pleased to announce the launch of a modernized PBP for Contract Year (CY) 2024. The new PBP software will migrate from its current client/server based platform to a new web-based module within HPMS. In addition, CMS will offer an application programming interface (API) option for plans and third party vendors.

As part of this technical redesign, CMS has updated the user interface as well as the data entry workflow. To provide downstream users with more time to transition, CMS will map the new PBP variables to the current database structure for the foreseeable future.

Note: The Bid Pricing Tool (BPT) will continue in current Excel-based format.
