Frequently Asked Questions: Question 1	Change to: Does a Part B deductible or coinsurance apply for adult immunizations covered by Medicare? Neither a Part B deductible nor coinsurance applies to the influenza virus or pneumococcal vaccines. However, a Part B deductible plus 20 percent of the Medicare coinsurance amount applies to the Hepatitis B Virus (HBV) vaccine.
