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



Pillar 1: Promote Evidence-Based Prevention



Mechanisms to Promote Evidence-Based Prevention

The CMS Innovation Center will embed preventive care in all model designs.



PATIENTS

Offer incentives for sustained healthy lifestyle changes

Provide lifestyle **education and support**, including exercise and nutrition programs

Reduce cost sharing for preventive services



PROVIDERS

Increase incentives for utilization of existing covered services

Offer flexibility for care design or shared visits

Include prevention-focused quality measures




COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Offer incentives and/or referrals to increase utilization of **nutrition and exercise support programs**

Provide **transportation** to medical care




Key Outcomes: Better Health, Less Disease



- Prevent onset of disease
- ✓ Improve function, health status and well-being
- Reduce adverse events and acute care utilization
- ✓ Slow or halt disease progression
- Increase time at home and avoid longterm care

Pillar 2: Empower People to Achieve Their Health Goals


Give patients **tools**, **information** and **data** to support their health goals



Mechanisms to Empower People

TECHNOLOGY AND DATA SHARING

- ✓ Increase patient access to information and tools, including mobile apps, for disease management and healthy living
- ✓ Publish data about providers and services, including cost and quality performance, to support patient decision making



INCENTIVES AND FLEXIBILITIES

- Direct accountability for quality and whole health outcomes and costs
- ✓ Flexible spending accounts
- ✓ Performance incentives tied to patientcentered quality measures, including PROMs, ADLs, lifestyle

INFORMED DECISION MAKING

- ✓ Shared decision-making tools
- ✓ Health education materials
- ✓ Provider cost and quality performance data

Pillar 3: Drive Choice and Competition



SUPPORT FOR PROVIDERS



Opportunities to Drive Choice and Competition

Allow market forces to primarily shape how health care is provisioned and how patients choose to utilize care

INCREASE INDEPENDENT PHYSICIAN PARTICIPATION

PROMOTE CHOICE IN CARE

IMPROVE MODEL ADMINISTRATION

Provide options of new models or tracks within models for independent providers

Expand the use of advance shared savings and prospective payments to support independent physicians

Test Medicare Advantage payment designs that better align with promoting whole health

Promote **site neutral payments** across settings

Support **expanded scopes of practice**, virtual care, and at-home care

Minimize mid-model changes

Standardize model design features

Allow models to **operate until final evaluation** results are available if no successor model has been designed
