**APPENDIX D:
Guidance for Reporting Data Into the
Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's
National Healthcare Safety Network**



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1. Overview

Beginning with the FY 2012 IRF/PPS Final Rule,¹ the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) adopted the requirement that inpatient rehabilitation facilities (IRFs) are to report data on National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN) measures. Currently, there are a total of three measures:

- National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN) Catheter-Associated Urinary Tract Infection (CAUTI) Outcome Measure [CMIT Measure ID #00459 (CBE-endorsed)]
- Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel Measure [CMIT Measure ID #00390 (CBE-endorsed)]
- National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN) Facility-wide Inpatient Hospital-onset *Clostridium difficile* Infection (CDI) Outcome Measure [CMIT Measure ID #00462 (CBE-endorsed)]

Each IRF must submit data for the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure and the NHSN Facility-wide Inpatient Hospital-onset CDI Outcome Measure on all patients from all inpatient locations, regardless of payer. Additionally, each IRF must submit Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel data for all healthcare personnel (HCP) physically working in the inpatient locations for at least 1 day between October 1 and March 31. IRFs report four categories of HCP to NHSN: employees, licensed independent practitioners (LIPs), adult students/trainees and volunteers, and other contract personnel.

Compliance with the IRF Quality Reporting Program (QRP) requires submission of data for the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure and the NHSN Facility-wide Inpatient Hospital-onset CDI Outcome Measure irrespective of whether patients have the infection or event of interest during the reporting period. In the event that no patients have the infection or event of interest during the reporting period, the IRF is still required to submit monthly denominator counts (i.e., device days and patient days) along with the “no event” indicators to CDC’s NHSN. For reporting of the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure and the NHSN Facility-wide Inpatient Hospital-onset CDI Outcome Measure, CDC’s NHSN requires that data be submitted on a monthly basis and strongly encourages IRFs to enter each month’s data within 30 days of the end of the month in which they are collected (e.g., data for October should be entered into the NHSN by November 30).

As of October 1, 2018, IRFs are no longer required to submit data for NHSN Facility-wide Inpatient Hospital-onset Methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (MRSA) Bacteremia Outcome Measure for the IRF QRP. However, reporting on this data is required for certain IRFs based on state and local mandates. Please check your state and local mandates to ensure you are in compliance with their reporting requirements.

While CMS strongly agrees with CDC’s recommended reporting time frames (providers should report an infection within 30 days following the event), for the purpose of meeting data submission requirements related to applicable annual increase factor (AIF), providers must submit all data collected during a given calendar year (CY) quarter no later than the quarterly data submission deadlines, approximately 4.5 months or 135 days following the end of each CY quarter. Although providers must submit monthly data, providers are not required to log onto the NHSN on a monthly basis to submit these data. Providers may log on and submit data for all 3 months within a given CY quarter at the same time, providing that data are submitted prior to the CY quarterly deadlines. CDC has an annual facility survey that is specific to IRFs and has specific location types to support facilities with data submission for the IRF QRP. Additionally, acute care hospitals (ACHs) and other settings can include units designated as IRFs (CMS-certified Rehabilitation Unit mapped as a location within the hospital, i.e., the CMS Certification Number (CCN) for the Rehabilitation Unit includes an “R” or “T” in the 3rd position). These IRF units will be required to complete a small annual survey found within their ACH facility. Questions on this small survey are only to be answered with information from the CMS-certified IRF unit. Reporting of the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure, the NHSN Facility-wide Inpatient Hospital-onset CDI Outcome Measure, and the Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel data is required. To fulfill the CMS IRF QRP requirements, each facility’s data for the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure and the NHSN Facility-wide Inpatient Hospital-onset CDI Outcome Measure must be entered into the CDC’s NHSN no later than 135 days after the end of the reporting quarter. In other words, for first quarter (Q1) data (January 1–March 31) to be shared with CMS, data must be entered into NHSN by August 15.²

CDC submits the data to CMS on behalf of the facility, according to the facility’s monthly reporting plan. Data submitted to CDC more than 135 days after the end of the reporting quarter, such as data submitted to the CDC NHSN after August 15 for Q1 of that same CY, will not be provided to CMS and will not be considered for the purpose of compliance determination.

IRFs are able to review data submitted to CMS on their behalf through the “Analysis – Reports” function within NHSN. More information regarding the location and interpretation of these

For the Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel data, the reporting period consists of the influenza vaccination season. The data collection reporting period is from October 1 of a given year through March 31 of that subsequent year, and final data must be submitted by May 15 of the same subsequent year.

For Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel reporting, entering a single influenza vaccination summary report at the end of the reporting period for the influenza season will meet the minimum data requirements for NHSN participation. However, CDC encourages HCP influenza vaccination summary counts to be updated on a monthly basis, and each update kept on printed paper copy, so that they can be used at the facility level to monitor vaccination rates and inform influenza vaccination activities.

NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure Reporting

For reporting data on the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure under the IRF QRP, IRFs must adhere to the definitions and reporting requirements for CAUTIs as specified in CDC's *NHSN Patient Safety Component Manual*, available at <https://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/pdfs/pscmanual/7pscCAUTICurrent.pdf>

These requirements include reporting denominator data (patient days and urinary catheter days) by location, as well as CAUTIs (event data), to NHSN each month. Monthly denominator data must be reported on CAUTIs regardless of whether an infection occurred in the IRF. Monthly reporting plans must be created or updated to include CAUTI surveillance in all locations that require reporting (i.e., surveillance must be “in-plan”). All required data fields in the numerator and the denominator, including the “no events” field for any month during which no CAUTIs were identified, must be submitted to NHSN. NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure Reporting

For reporting data on the NHSN CDI Outcome Measure under the IRF QRP, IRFs must adhere to the definitions and reporting requirements for CDI LabID events as specified in the NHSN Multidrug-Resistant Organism (MDRO) and *Clostridioides difficile* Infection (CDI) Module protocol http://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/PDFs/pscManual/12pscMDRO_CDADcurrent.pdf. NHSN Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel Reporting

For reporting data on the Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel measure under the IRF QRP, IRFs must adhere to the definitions and reporting requirements for this measure as specified in the CDC's *NHSN Healthcare Personnel Safety Component Protocol*, available at <https://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/pdfs/hps-manual/vaccination/hps-flu-vaccine-protocol-508.pdf>

To report Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel data, the NHSN Healthcare Personnel Safety (HPS) Component must be activated. The monthly reporting plan (MRP) is no longer required to complete beginning with the 2022-2023 influenza season. Instead, upon saving or uploading data, users will agree to the following: (1) The data reported are consistent with definitions outlined in NHSN surveillance protocols (including tables of instructions and frequently asked questions) and (2) The data will be sent to CMS to fulfill CMS quality reporting requirements (when applicable). Reporting begins when the influenza vaccine first becomes available. HCP are eligible for the measure if they are working at the IRF for at least 1 working day between October 1 and March 31. (Please see the *Healthcare Personnel Safety Component Protocol* for the reporting instructions.) Please note that whereas the NHSN allows reporting of this quality measure data throughout the CY, CMS only requires that IRFs collect and report this data between October 1 and March 31 (what is considered the reporting period for the influenza season) to meet compliance requirements for reporting Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel data.

General NHSN Reporting

To report data for the IRF QRP through CDC's NHSN, the IRF must be enrolled in the NHSN. Enrollment steps are outlined in the *NHSN Facility Administrator Enrollment Guide* available at <http://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/pdfs/gen-support/facilityadminenrollmentguidecurrent.pdf>. The information in the rest of this chapter supplements information available to the IRFs through the *NHSN Facility Administrator Enrollment Guide*.

Reminder: IRFs can be enrolled in NHSN as units in Acute Care Hospitals or other settings designated as IRFs **OR** as freestanding Inpatient Rehabilitation Facilities. If your IRF is not enrolled in NHSN as a separate facility, and instead is currently submitting data as part of an acute care hospital, i.e., as an acute care hospital unit designated as an IRF, it must have its own unique IRF CCN. If your IRF is a freestanding inpatient rehabilitation facility and is not currently enrolled in NHSN as a separate facility, it will have to be enrolled in NHSN as a separate facility with a unique orgID that is identified as an IRF. If you have questions or need assistance, please contact the CDC NHSN Help Desk at NHSN@cdc.gov

If your IRF is already enrolled as an IRF in the NHSN, please do the following:

1. Confirm that your CMS Certification Number (CCN) and CCN Effective Date are correctly entered on the Facility Information screen. Specific guidance for adding/updating your facility's CCN or CCN Effective Date within NHSN can be found at: www.cdc.gov/nhsn/pdfs/cms/changing-ccn-within-nhsn.pdf

2. Before IRF Begins Enrollment Process

- Consult technical and legal requirements for the NHSN at <https://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/inpatient-rehab/index.html>
- Appoint a person from your facility as the NHSN Facility Administrator to complete the NHSN enrollment process. The person in charge of Infection Prevention/Control is an appropriate choice. This person will be responsible for enrolling the facility in NHSN and will serve as the contact person for NHSN.
- You will need your facility's CCN or relevant identifier code to complete the NHSN enrollment process.
- Note that after the facility is enrolled in NHSN, the NHSN Facility Administrator can add other users to assist with surveillance and reporting activities. We strongly urge each IRF to set up an alternative or substitute user ensuring the IRF's ability to submit timely data, regardless of staff absence or turnover.

3. Basic Steps to NHSN Enrollment and Data Submission

1. Review the *NHSN Facility Administrator Enrollment Guide*: www.cdc.gov/nhsn/pdfs/gen-support/facilityadminenrollmentguidecurrent.pdf. Complete the following sections of the training, available at www.cdc.gov/nhsn/training/:

2. Register for the NHSN, which includes accepting the NHSN Rules of Behavior and providing your contact information at <https://nhsn.cdc.gov/RegistrationForm/index>. If you use an identifier other than your CCN during the enrollment process, you must enter your CCN on NHSN's Facility Information screen after your facility is enrolled to ensure that the appropriate data are shared with CMS.
3. Register for Secure Access Management Services (SAMS) and complete the Identity Proofing Verification form.
4. Electronically submit your facility's enrollment forms, including a Facility Contact form and a Facility Survey. It is recommended that you print and complete the paper forms and then enter the information online.
5. Print and complete the Agreement to Participate and Consent Form that will be e-mailed to you. The form must be signed by a senior executive at your facility. The IRF must complete and sign this form and fax it to CDC at (404) 929-0131 within 60 days of receiving it.
6. All patient care units will need to be added as location(s) and mapped in NHSN in advance by a facility user.
7. Use the following NHSN Monthly checklist to ensure complete reporting to the CMS IRFQR Program: <https://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/pdfs/cms/IRFs-freestand-Monthly-Checklist-CMS-IQR.pdf>
8. The locations must also be added to the monthly reporting plan under the device-associated module section for each month you plan on submitting the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure to CMS. After adding the location, please remember to check the "CAUTI" box to ensure that the data will be appropriately sent to CMS.
9. The FacWideIN location must also be selected in the Monthly Reporting Plan for LabID C. difficile All Specimens to meet the LabID Event reporting requirements.

10. Begin reporting data into the NHSN Web-based application.
 - Fill out a Urinary Tract Infection event form for each CAUTI identified in the IRF location(s). The form can be found at: www.cdc.gov/nhsn/forms/57.114_UTI_BLANK.pdf. Instructions for completing the form can be found at: www.cdc.gov/nhsn/forms/instr/57_114.pdf
11. Complete a monthly summary form for the device-associated data. The number of patient days and indwelling catheter days for the location must be reported, even if that number was zero. To report data, use the Denominators for Intensive Care Unit/Other Locations form, which can be found at: www.cdc.gov/nhsn/forms/57.118_DenominatorICU_BLANK.pdf. Instructions for completing the form are available at: www.cdc.gov/nhsn/forms/instr/57_118.pdf
12. If no CAUTI events were identified for the month, the “Report No Events” box must be checked for the appropriate surveillance type on the Denominator for “Intensive Care Unit/Other Locations” screen within the NHSN application. More information on how to report zero CAUTI events for a month is available at <https://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/PDFs/CMS/how-to-report-No-Events-CLAB-CAU.pdf>
13. Complete a monthly summary form for the CDI data. The number of patient days and admissions for the IRF facility must be reported, even if no events were identified that month. To report data, use the MDRO and CDI Prevention Process and Outcome Measures Monthly Reporting form, which can be found at: www.cdc.gov/nhsn/forms/57.127_mdromonthlyreporting_blank.pdf. 14. If no CDI laboratory-identified events were identified for the month, the “Report No Events” box must be checked for the appropriate surveillance type on the Denominator for “MDRO and CDI Prevention Process and Outcome Measures Monthly Monitoring” screen within the NHSN application.
15. Fill out the Healthcare Personnel Influenza Vaccination Summary Form for Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel. This form can be found at: <https://www.cdc.gov/nhsn/forms/57-214-HCP-Influenza-Vaccination-Summary-Form.pdf>. 4. Additional Tips and Hints

- Follow the step-by-step instructions in the *NHSN Facility Administrator Enrollment Guide*, found at: www.cdc.gov/nhsn/pdfs/gen-support/facilityadminenrollmentguidecurrent.pdf
 - You must complete the steps *in order*.
 - Allow several days for this process, because several steps require you to wait for information from CDC.
- Use the buttons and arrows on the NHSN Web pages instead of the browser's "back" button.
- Use your professional e-mail address, not your personal e-mail address, and be consistent. Use the same one for all fields requiring an e-mail address. The e-mail address you use to apply for your SAMS credentials must match the one you used to register in NHSN.
- Locate your facility's CCN or relevant identifier code.
- Remember the password you created when you applied for your SAMS credentials; that password will be required each time you access NHSN.
- Facilities with separate CCNs must register as separate facilities, and each facility will need to identify and set up its location types.
- You may join or organize a group that reports to NHSN collectively, but first you must enroll with NHSN. Once the facility is enrolled, the Group Administrator should send an invitation and password for the group. Your facility must report data individually, but the group will be able to see data for which you confer rights.
- NHSN requires that a unique organization ID be created for separate facilities at physically separate locations, even if those facilities share a CCN. If this is not done, the ability to clearly track and analyze infections by specific locations is compromised, and it becomes difficult to target prevention efforts effectively.
- If a single unit has more than one type of patient population, report the location according to which population makes up 80% or more of the unit, on average, over a year. For example, if 80% of the patients in the unit are pediatric and 20% are adult, the location would be reported as pediatric. If no patient population in the unit fulfills this "80% rule," please see instructions for mapping patient care locations at www.cdc.gov/nhsn/PDFs/pscManual/15LocationsDescriptions_current.pdf. If you still have questions, then you may contact the NHSN Help Desk at NHSN@cdc.gov for additional guidance.

- Once a patient's information is entered into the NHSN, new events can be added for that patient using the Patient Find feature, provided that the same patient identifier is used.

- Be sure that all events entered into NHSN are completed. Although an event may be saved without “completing” the event, only data for completed events will be sent by CDC to CMS.
- Facilities will have approximately 135 days following the end of a quarter before NHSN freezes the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure, and the NHSN Facility-wide Inpatient Hospital-onset CDI Outcome Measure, and CDC sends the data to CMS.
- For the Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel measure, the reporting period for the influenza season is from October 1 of a given year through March 31 of that subsequent year and must be submitted by May 15 of the same subsequent year. Facilities can edit their data after May 15, but the revised data will not be shared with CMS.
- An IRF patient’s stay may exceed this freeze date. If so, a potential death determination on the Healthcare-Associated Infections (HAI) Event record would not be possible. Users should enter the patient’s status at the time of data entry, and then update this variable if AND when the patient’s status changes (i.e., the patient dies). This will ensure that all the data are marked as complete at the time of the freeze date and can be sent to CMS.
- IRFs do not need to confer rights to CMS. CDC submits data to CMS on behalf of the IRF.

Notes on Reporting the NHSN CAUTI Outcome Measure

- Only those events that meet the NHSN’s current CAUTI criteria should be reported. If a patient has more than one CAUTI event during their stay, an additional CAUTI would be reportable if the CAUTI occurs outside the 14-day Repeat Infection Timeframe. For more guidance on identifying and reporting repeat infections, please refer to www.cdc.gov/nhsn/PDFs/pscManual/2PSC_IdentifyingHAIs_NHSNcurrent.pdf
- There is no exclusion for CAUTIs that are clinically believed to be related to an infection at another site (e.g., a wound). If a CAUTI meets NHSN criteria, the CAUTI must be reported. Note that NHSN uses surveillance definitions, which may vary from clinical definitions.
- If your facility’s monthly reporting plan requires reporting of both device-associated infections (e.g., CAUTI) and LabID events, then individual and separate events for each will need to be entered separately.
- A CAUTI Standardized Infection Ratio (SIR) will be generated using the 2022 national IRF data as the baseline for data from 2025.
- If a patient is transferred from another facility or location, and the date of event is on the day of transfer, or the next day, the infection is attributed to the transferring facility/location. Infections attributed to another facility do not need to be entered into NHSN by the receiving facility.
- Although it is not required, CDC strongly recommends sharing information with the transferring facility about HAIs identified in transferred patients to ensure the accuracy of data reported from all facilities.

Notes on Reporting Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel

- Individuals who physically work in the facility for at least 1 day from October 1 to March 31 are included in the count of healthcare personnel, regardless of clinical responsibility or patient contact.
- The influenza vaccination summary data report will need to be submitted only once/annually to CMS.
- Facilities are required to report summary-level vaccination data and not individual-level vaccination data.
- NHSN defines influenza season as July 1 to June 30. However, IRFs are not required to report on 12 months of data. IRFs must report data for the period specified in the NHSN protocol, which is October 1 to March 31 in the denominator, including all vaccinations given during the influenza season in the numerator (whenever the seasonal influenza vaccine became available, to March 31).
- The Influenza Vaccination Coverage Among Healthcare Personnel reporting in NHSN consists of a single data entry screen per influenza season. Therefore, every time a user enters updated data for a particular influenza season, all previously entered data for that season will be overwritten and a new modified date will be auto-filled by the system. IRFs wishing to maintain monthly records are encouraged to save their own copies of each data entry. Facilities will also always be able to review the final healthcare personnel influenza vaccination summary data report that is transmitted to CMS.
