States Submitting Letters of Intent – Financial Alignment Models February 2012

The following States have submitted letters of intent to CMS and are continuing to explore pursuing one or both of the Medicare-Medicaid financial alignment models described in the July 8, 2011, State Medicaid Directors' letter. These models are intended to improve beneficiary experiences and quality outcomes, while also reducing costs for individuals eligible for both Medicaid and Medicare.

These two models are:

- Capitated Model: A State, CMS, and a health plan enter into a threeway contract, and the plan receives a prospective blended payment to provide comprehensive, coordinated care.
- Managed Fee-for-Service Model: A State and CMS enter into an agreement by which the State would be eligible to benefit from savings resulting from initiatives designed to improve quality and reduce costs for both Medicare and Medicaid.

Under these models, CMS is interested in approaches that integrate care across the full range of primary, acute, behavioral health and long term supports and services, with implementation beginning in 2012.

For some states, the letter of intent is a continuation of program development work that has been underway for several months. For other States, the letter may initiate a comprehensive planning and design process. But for all States, program design and any eventual implementation must include ongoing, meaningful stakeholder participation. Finally, please note that submitting a letter of intent only means that a State is expressing interest in these models. It is non-binding for the State and for CMS.
