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How to Locate Specific Transmittals/Change Requests (CRs) of Interest That Are Posted on Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Web Sites

Background

CMS Program Transmittals/Change Requests (CRs) are used to communicate new or changed policies, and/or procedures that are being incorporated into a specific CMS program manual, and MLN Matters articles are written about selected CMS Transmittals/Change Requests to assist providers in understanding these transmittals.

Each MLN Matters article usually has a section included at the end of the article titled *Additional Information* that includes a variation of the following statement:

For complete details (regarding this Change Request XXXX), please see the official instruction issued to your carrier/intermediary regarding this change. That instruction may be viewed at <http://www.cms.gov/Regulations-and-Guidance/Guidance/Transmittals/index.html> on the CMS website.

From that page select the year in which the CR was released and that will take you to the search page for transmittals. On that page you may enter one of the selection options to narrow your search for the CR(s).

Once you have accessed the desired Transmittal/CR website, you can also sort the results by clicking your mouse on any column heading. To reverse the order of the sort for that column, click the columns again. The sort order will be indicated by the sort order icon indicated by an up and down arrows.

For some users, once you have accessed the desired Transmittal/CR website, type Ctrl F (i.e., hold down the Control (Ctrl) key first, then press the 'f' key), and a 'Find' box will appear. Type the desired CR number in the 'Find What?' box, press the enter key, and you will be taken directly to the CR of interest which will be highlighted.
