#### Medicare Shared Savings Program: Submit Notice of Intent to Apply by June 28

There is only one day left to submit a Notice of Intent to Apply (NOIA) via the <u>Accountable Care Organization</u> (<u>ACO) Management System</u> (ACO-MS) for a January 1, 2020, start date. You must submit a NOIA if you intend to apply to the BASIC track or ENHANCED track of the Medicare Shared Savings Program, for a Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) 3-Day Rule Waiver, and/or to establish and operate a Beneficiary Incentive Program:

- NOIA submissions are due no later than June 28 at noon ET
- A NOIA submission does not bind your organization to submit an application; however, you must submit a NOIA to be eligible to apply
- Submit only one NOIA per ACO
- You can make changes to your track, repayment mechanisms, and other NOIA-related information during the application submission period

ACOs that applied for a July 1, 2019, start date and withdrew their application or were denied are eligible to submit a NOIA for the January 1, 2020 start date. If the NOIA is approved, you will be able to access ACO-MS using your existing login credentials.

The application submission period is July 1 through July 29 at noon ET.

#### MIPS Data Validation and Audit for Performance Years 2017 and 2018

CMS contracted with Guidehouse to conduct data validation and audits of some Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) eligible clinicians. Data validation and audits will help ensure MIPS is operating with accurate and useful data. MIPS eligible clinicians, groups, and virtual groups are required by <u>regulation</u> to comply with data sharing requests, providing all data as requested by CMS.

If you are selected for data validation and/or audit, you will receive a request for information from Guidehouse via email or by certified mail. You have 45 calendar days from the date of the notice to provide the requested information.
