Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative Frequently Asked Questions on Eligibility to Participate in Practice Transformation Networks (PTN)

Q: Can practices simultaneously be part of a Medicare Accountable Care Organization and enroll in the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative?

A: Participation in a Medicare Accountable Care Organization precludes enrollment into a Practice Transformation Network under the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative.

Q: Can practices participate in both the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative and the Medicare Shared Savings Program at the same time?

A: No, the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative does not permit practices that are part of an Accountable Care Organizations, such as the Medicare Shared Savings Program, to participate in the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative. This means that a practice's Medicare-enrolled billing Tax Identification Number (TIN) cannot participate in both the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative and the Medicare Shared Savings Program.

Q: Will Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+) practices still be able to participate in the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative?

A: A clinician or practice cannot participate in both the CPC+ and the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative at the same time Clinical practices enrolled in the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative can apply for and enroll in CPC+, but if selected into the CPC+ program, the practice and clinicians must exit or disenroll from the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative. A clinician or practice cannot participate in both the CPC+ and the Transforming Clinical Practice Initiative at the same time.
