I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Background: Currently, Medicare payment for most durable medical equipment, prosthetics, orthotics, and supplies (DMEPOS) is based on fee schedules. However, Section 1847 of the Social Security Act (the Act) mandates competitive bidding programs to replace the current DMEPOS fee schedule payment amounts for selected items in selected areas.

The statute provides that competitive bidding will apply to durable medical equipment (DME) meeting the definition of a "covered item" as specified in Section 1834(a)(13) of the Act, including items used in infusion and drugs (other than inhalation drugs) and supplies used in conjunction with DME, but excluding class III devices under the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act. Competitive bidding will also apply to items and services described in Section 1842(s)(2)(D) of the Act, other than parenteral nutrients, equipment, and supplies. Further, competitive bidding will apply to off-the-shelf orthotics described in Section 1861(s)(9) for which payment would otherwise be made under Section 1834(h) which require minimal self-adjustment for appropriate use and do not require expertise in trimming, bending, molding, assembling, or customizing to fit the individual. Exceptions may be granted for items and services for which the application of competitive bidding is not likely to result in significant savings or to permit continuity of an existing relationship between a beneficiary and a supplier with respect to furnishing either a rental item or oxygen.

The statute also provides for phasing in competitive bidding beginning in 2007 in 10 of the largest metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs). The program will be expanded into 70 additional MSAs in 2009 and, after 2009, the program will be expanded into additional areas. Areas that may be exempt from competitive acquisition of DMEPOS include rural areas and areas with low population density within urban areas that are not competitive, unless there is a significant national market through mail order for a particular item or service.

This transmittal provides information for educational purposes regarding the ten competitive bidding areas (CBAs) in which bidding will occur in CY 2007 under the final rule, CMS-1270-F, "Competitive Acquisition for Certain Durable Medical Equipment, Prosthetics, Orthotics and Supplies (DMEPOS) and Other Issues." Information regarding the competitive bid product categories included in the CY 2007 DMEPOS Competitive Bidding Program is also included in this transmittal.
