I. GENERAL INFORMATION

- **A. Background:** An Account Receivable (AR) that is in a redetermination or reconsideration status qualifies for limitations on recoupment. The AR's status must be monitored to make sure an appeal was actually filed and/or it is updated to reflect the decision of the redetermination or reconsideration. The monitoring of ARs that are in either status is critical in determining if the ARs should no longer qualify for limitations on recoupment.
- **B.** Policy: Overpayments that are in the first (redetermination) or second (reconsideration) level of appeal are subject to limitations on recoupment as mandated by Section 935(f)(2)(a) of the Medicare Modernization Act of 2003. The request for a redetermination appeal must be filed within 120 days after the date of the initial demand/determination letter. The request for a reconsideration appeal must be filed within 180 days from the redetermination decision date. The maximum number of days that an AR shall be in a redetermination or reconsideration status is 120 days per status.
