I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Background: Section 306 of the Medicare Prescription Drug and Modernization Act (MMA) of 2003 required the Secretary of Heath and Human Services to utilize Recovery Audit Contractors (RAC) to identify Medicare underpayments and overpayments and recoup overpayments under the Medicare program for services for which payment is made under part A or B of title XVIII of the Social Security Act.

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) tasked the RACs with performing claim review to identify Medicare underpayments and overpayments. Once a potential overpayment is identified, the claim must be adjusted to reflect the correct payment. The claim adjustment, the creation of the accounts receivable and the setup of offset occurs by the FI, Carrier, DMERC, DME MAC or MAC.

The RACs have identified large numbers of overpayments. These overpayments can be categorized by claim type or service type. Some of the standard systems allow some user ability to process adjustments on a mass basis; however this has not reduced the number of claims needing adjustment.
