On December 30, 2016, the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of the Treasury (the Departments) approved Hawai'i's section 1332 waiver. Hawai'i's application sought to waive the requirement under section 1311(b)(1)(B) to operate a Small Business Health Options Program (SHOP) and other requirements related to SHOP Exchanges. It is the Department of the Treasury's final administrative determination that, subject to sequestration at the fiscal year 2018 rate of 6.6 percent (\$65,939), Hawai'i's net pass-through amount is \$933,130 for calendar year 2018.

Per our letter dated December 30, 2016, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the Department of the Treasury (collectively, the Departments) approved Hawai'i's Section 1332 waiver application on December 30, 2016 to waive the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) requirement that a Small Business Health Options Program (SHOP) operate in Hawai'i and other related requirements relevant to SHOP Exchanges. The approval letter outlined that the total pass-through amount for the 2017 to 2021 waiver period is estimated to be \$2,795,766. The amount of pass-through funding for calendar years 2018 through 2021 will be calculated by the Departments annually (per ACA section 1332(a)(3)) and reported to the State. The pass-through funding for calendar year 2018 is estimated to be \$999,069. This amount will be subject to a final administrative determination by the Treasury prior to payment. In addition, this amount will be subject to sequestration in 2018. As a result, amounts payable in fiscal year 2018 will be reduced by 6.6 percent.
